





INTERPOL E-Evidence Boot Camp (EEBC)

17 June to 11 August 2019

If you face challenges understanding the concepts behind electronic evidence and would like to improve your knowledge of how to determine the authenticity, reliability and integrity of digital evidence, INTERPOL has a solution for you.

The INTERPOL E-Evidence Boot Camp (EEBC) is a **free E-learning course** delivered by INTERPOL Project SCORPIUS¹ and the Cybercrime Capacity Building Project in the Americas² in collaboration with University College Dublin - Digital Forensic Investigation Research Laboratory (DigitalFIRE). The course will take place from **17 June to 11 August 2019**.

Course Objectives

By attending this online course you will have the opportunity to **improve your understanding** of the key aspects of computing, information technology and digital forensics as they pertain to the evaluation of digital evidence that could be presented in court.

This course will also be an opportunity to **develop a professional network and share experiences**, challenges and best practices with like-minded people **worldwide** and some of the best experts in the field of digital forensic.

> Target Audience

This course is open to Law Enforcement Officers, Prosecutors and Judges of all INTERPOL member countries. The only requirements are to have: an excellent command of English, basic computer literacy, access to a computer and an Internet connection.

Commitment

The EEBC will be delivered **100% online** and will require a commitment of approximately **2.5 hours per weeks over 8 weeks from 17 June to 11 August 2019**, allowing it to fit into your busy schedule. Interaction is key to the success of this course, thus participants will be invited to participate in a dedicated forum, attend webinars, as well as complete assignments at the end of each week (anonymization of your participation is possible).

Dr Pavel Gladyshev is a lecturer at the University College Dublin (Ireland), where he established the MSc programme in the field of Digital Forensics for Law Enforcement. Dr Gladyshev started working with Law Enforcement in 1998 when he oversaw the creation of the first Irish training course in cybercrime investigation for the Irish national police. Dr Gladyshev holds a PhD in the field of Digital Forensics and is leading the Digital Forensics Investigation Research Laboratory (DigitalFIRE), focusing on the development of new investigative technologies.

Mr Sébastien Lafrance is a Crown Prosecutor for the Public Prosecution Service of Canada and a former part-time Professor of Law at the University of Ottawa. He clerked at the Supreme Court of Canada and at the Quebec Court of Appeal. He has published articles on constitutional and criminal law. Mr Lafrance completed the courses for a Master in Law at Laval University and he is currently finalizing his thesis. Mr Lafrance won with his teammates a public international law moot court and he studied private international law at the The Hague Academy of International Law.
